

Are we incurable optimists?

We live in troubled times, marked by crises and war. The world order is being redrawn, and we read about restrictions on freedom of expression and a decline in the number of democracies. At the same time, algorithms feed us ominous portrayals of reality and misinformation.

At the Gothenburg Book Fair, we have always believed that culture and literature are essential to democracy — that education is the foundation of society. We may be incurable optimists, but we continue to repeat the mantra: book fairs make a difference. Many of us thirst for knowledge, seek long-term perspectives, and strive to create a sustainable world for the next generation.

This year's seminar programme centres more questions about our present day and culture than ever before. What's happened to the working classes? Who should we talk to when the whole world has gone mad? Is peace in the Middle East a utopian fantasy? Is Norway a role model in the fight against climate change, or a fossil fuel giant? Has Sweden as a nation of knowledge reached the end of the road? How should we behave towards one another? Many of the brightest minds of our time will be discussing Trump's USA, women and war, the oppression of queer people, migration and the loss of cultural heritage, and Russia's merciless war in Ukraine. We are also delighted to welcome to Gothenburg the author Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie, this year's recipient of Sjöjungfrun, the Mermaid Award.

As part of our Love and Lust theme, some of our most thought-provoking authors will be exploring the romance genre, the history of love, and sex in literature versus real life.

For the first time, drama — one of the fundamental forms of literature — will also feature in our seminar programme. The Drama theme will give you a chance to meet dramatists and performing artists, while a selection of performances will be hosted in our new Theatre Room. We're particularly gratified to welcome globally renowned playwrights Tony Kushner and Roland Schimmelpfennig.

We believe that literature, drama, love and conversation all help us to process and understand the reality in which we live. In times when cultural activities are being challenged and questioned, we are proud to once again fill the many spaces in our venue with authors, researchers, philosophers, dramatists, politicians, songwriters and readers.

Drama

With the theme of Drama, we bring the performing arts to Gothenburg Book Fair and explore how playwrights, through their writing, portray the major issues of our time. We highlight drama as a distinct literary genre, showcase its unique ability to bring words to life on stage, and make it accessible to a wider audience.

The theme is organised by Colombine Teaterförlag (Sweden), Dramatikkens hus (Norway), Estonian Theatre Agency, Theatre Info Finland (TINFO) and Gothenburg Book Fair, in collaboration with Latvian Theatre Workers Union and Lithuanian Theatre Information Centre with additional support from Danske Dramatikere (Denmark) and Performing Arts Iceland.



Guest of Honour

The Guest of Honour sets the tone and the theme for Gothenburg Book Fair, offering visitors a unique opportunity to explore the literature, culture, and ideas of a specific region. While there is no Guest of Honour in 2025, we are delighted to announce that Québec will take centre stage in 2026.

THE GUEST OF Honour benefits from a large-scale, eye-catching and centrally-located stand at the event which is guaranteed to receive many visitors. Our food outlets tailor their range to the Guest's culinary highlights, readings and artists from their country are showcased at VIP receptions, and the opening of the Book Fair as a whole takes place at the Guest's stand under the gaze of cultural stakeholders, authors, journalists, politicians and readers.

AS OUR PROMINENT Guest of Honour and the centre of attention, the Guest will be afforded a unique opportunity to market its country, culture, literature and authors to more than 80,000 visitors and in excess of 700 journalists. The book fair generates over 7,000 articles in the media, and highlighting our Guest of Honour is always at the top of our agenda.

PAST GUESTS OF Honour include Brazil, Estonia, Germany, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, the Netherlands, the Nordic countries, Poland, Romania, South Africa, South Korea, Spain and the United Kingdom.

The Guest of Honour programme is our flagship: it is the defining way to shape and influence the Book Fair in-depth. Other avenues include our Voices from-programme, aimed at raising interest in a country's contemporary literature and writers. It is a smaller scale programme, featuring a curated selection of seminars highlighting authors and experts from a guest country or institution, hosting a stand and a cultural programme on the fair floor as well as a reception in honour of participating authors. In recent years, we've presented voices from Iceland, Catalonia, Ireland, Italy, Bangladesh and Ukraine.

In 2025, Gothenburg Book Fair explores Love and Lust—universal themes reflecting intimacy, relationships, and humanity's quest for closeness and meaning.



The Mermaid Award was established in 2024 as part of the Book Fair's 40th anniversary and is given annually to a fiction writer who has moved Swedish readers. The first recipient was Joyce Carol Oates. The 2025 Award goes to Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie.



International Rights Centre

Where books grow wings and find new readers.

GOTHENBURG BOOK FAIR is the most important marketplace for Nordic literature. In Sweden, almost one in five of all published books are translated from another language. Foreign authors account for 58 % of fiction sales. Our International Rights Centre (IRC) brings together a plethora of agents and publishers from around the world as they buy and sell rights. This represents an excellent business and networking opportunity. The Gothenburg IRC is renowned in the book industry as an intense professional forum which also manages to be quality driven, composed, professional and personal. Located in the much-appreciated K-hall, it brings agents and publishers together and supports their needs, while also affording them direct access to the rest of the exhibition centre. With our friendly, professional colleagues on hand, the IRC is sure to live up to comments such as "this is the nicest IRC in Europe."

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

TO INCREASE THE knowledge of Sweden's literature and book market the Swedish Arts Council and Gothenburg Book Fair provide a fellowship programme for translators from Swedish into other languages, as well as non-Nordic publishers and sub-agents interested in attending Gothenburg Book Fair. Travel costs, accomodation for three nights, and seminar cards are included in the offer.

The programme is partly pre-planned, with round table meetings, lectures on the Swedish book market and new Swedish literature as well as evening activities, and partly open with time set aside for individual meetings with agents in the Rights Centre. There will be both separate activities for translators and publishers as well as joint activities.

The fellowship is a great opportunity to get an overview of the Swedish and Nordic literature scene in just a couple of days.

IT WILL PASS

DRAMA Ever wondered how actors manage to learn so many lines? How they not only 'step into' a role — but also back out of it? And what it feels like to perform in a truly 'good' play? In this solo performance, Lithuanian actor, playwright and director JUSTAS TERTELIS takes us backstage — a treat for anyone who loves the theatre.

In her new book Allt har en smak av aska [Everything Tastes of Ash], CECILIA UDDÉN of Sveriges Radio writes about the new Middle East, where she believes that Israel's retribution following Hamas' attack will echo through the generations and lead to a hatred of Israel the like of which has rarely been seen before. At the end of 2023, some 47 million children were displaced globally — that is 47 million children forced to flee their homes to seek out safety and a life in a completely unfamiliar country. Dutch author EDWARD VAN DE VENDEL (Mishka), Norwegian INGVILD BJERKELAND (Beasts), Ukrainian TANIA GORYUSHINA and Swede JOSEFIN MICHANEK (Zlatas värld [Zlata's World]) have all portrayed what it is like to be a child and refugee in different ways. They will be in conversation with lawyer and lecturer DONA HARIRI about the different ways in which this important — and all too topical — issue can be depicted.

Israeli Author and Peace Activist

LIZZIE DORON is one of Israel's most acclaimed authors. She was raised by her mother, a Holocaust survivor, and when her own daughter wanted to know more about her story, Doron wrote her first autobiographical novel Why Didn't You Come Before the War? (first published in 1998 and published in Swedish in 2011). The book is now mandatory reading in Israeli schools and has been recognised by prizes in both Israel and abroad. She has since written several books on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. She was previously a journalist but is now a full-time author. DRAMA The starting point of the seminar is the hypothesis that while in Western Europe, there is increasing talk of the decline of art into the mire of political correctness and fears, in Estonia, the performing arts are still the opposite. There is boldness, poignancy, and poetic imagination. The aim is to talk about the burning issues of the European cultural space from the unique perspective of Estonians (without forgetting a bit of self-irony), asking "Quo vadis, European theatre"? The speakers are going to wonder if we are going ahead of any trends, point out the possible double standards, and focus on the problematic issues that plague the European theatre and cultural space in general. Beat poet Allen Ginsberg wrote that 'YANG LIAN distinguishes himself in representing the pain of life caught in between historic eras.' Yang Lian is tipped as a potential Nobel Prize winner and has a cult following. This marks the Chinese poet's first ever visit to the Gothenburg Book Fair. Yang Lian began writing during the Cultural Revolution and was a contributor to the underground literary journal Jintian. During a visit to New Zealand, he organised a memorial service for the victims of the 1989 Tiananmen Square massacre and has since been forced to live in exile.
